BOND ACADEMY 2021 SUMMER CAMP NEWS

WELCOME

Bond Academy is pleased to welcome you to our 2021 Summer Camp. We are very excited with the programs we are planning for this summer.

THEME WEEKS

As you know, each camp week has a theme. Weeks one and five are Arts and Crafts. Week two is sports. Week three is Cooking and week four is Carnival. Although the themes are similar in July and August, the activities will be different

ADDITIONAL WEEKS

If parents wish to add extra weeks for their campers, we must know the Thursday before the week in order to have proper staffing. Please indicate to your camper's teacher if you wish to apply for any additional weeks as numbers are restricted due to covid protocols.

MORNING PROGRAM

Each morning, campers will be picked up at the Before Camp program, if they arrive early, and will be taken to their classroom. If students arrive after 8:45 a.m., they may go directly to their classroom. In the morning, the students will work on a variety of academic assignments.

LUNCH & SNACKS

Lunch will begin at 11:45 a.m. Our cafeteria will not be in operation this summer due to covid protocols. Campers should bring a packed lunch from home.

Parents are requested to provide daily snacks for your child. Also, please provide enough drinks for the day. Students are asked to bring a refillable water bottle to use at our water stations.

SAFETY & SECURITY

In order to ensure the safety and security of our campers, we will be following the same routine we have for our day school. The code for entering the building, between 7:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m., is <u>43327B</u>. Between 9:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., you must use the front entrance of the school. The morning code will be used between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., to access the cafeteria door as the front entrance will be locked as of 4:30 p.m. Additional covid protocols to follow.

BEFORE AND AFTER CAMP PROGRAM

- Our facilities are open at 7:00 a.m., with our Counsellor in the Before Camp room.
- Our facilities close at 6:00 p.m. in the After Camp room.

Late fees in the After Camp program are \$1.00 per minute to be paid in cash to the counsellor in charge. Thank you for being on time.

CAMP HOURS

Camp runs from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

COVID-19 FACT SHEET – SUMMER CAMP 2021

Home Self Assessment: Each morning before leaving for camp, parents are expected to do a self-assessment on their family members by completing and submitting a survey answering "Yes" or "No" to a series of questions established by Toronto Health for self-assessment. That will include taking temperatures.

- If for any reason a child is sick, they are required to stay home. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SEND YOUR CHILD TO CAMP IF THEY ARE SICK or ANY MEMBER OF THE FAMILY ARE UNABLE TO ANSWER NO TO ALL THE ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS.
- Children that become ill during the day will be removed from class, isolated with supervision and parents will be contacted immediately. The child must be picked as soon as possible and not return until they are symptom-free, or have been cleared to return by a doctor.

Arrival at Camp: The overall goal of these procedures is to reduce foot traffic and congestion in the camp by limiting the entry of parents and caregivers into the camp building.

- All students, staff and parents must wear a mask at all times once they enter the school parking lot.
- Access restrictions will be based on the times and ages of students at drop off.
- When permitted, access is limited to one parent or caregiver per family during any allocated time.
- 1. Montessori and Kindergarten: Between 7 a.m. and 8:45 a.m. parents of our Montessori and Kindergarten classes will have access to the school to bring their children into the building. Access is limited to one parent or caregiver per family. Parents entering the building will be required to use a mask and use hand sanitizer when they enter.
 - o Once the child has been dropped off in the Before Camp Program, parents must leave.
- 2. Grades 1 to 6: Parents of students in Grades 1 to 6 should not enter the school but should drop off their children in the schoolyard.
 - Parents can drop off your children before 8 a.m. at the North or South Gate and visually monitor them until
 they enter the school or
 - Walk them to the entrance of the school to ensure that they arrive in the building safely. Parents or caregivers should not accompany the children into the building.
 - After 8 a.m., if the Before Camp Program is being held outside, students should enter the schoolyard and proceed to their designated cohort area. They do enter the school.
 - o If the Before Camp Program is not being held in the front yard, the students should:
 - Wearing their mask, enter the school, use hand sanitizer and proceed to the designated area for their cohort.

Masks: All students are required to bring masks to school. It is recommended that each student be provided with 2 masks per day; students must have access to a mask at all times.

- Masks have been mandated for all staff, parents, visitors and students, at all times in the school (except for eating or drinking). We have received no exemptions for that requirement.
 - o Masks should be the appropriate size, so they do not slip down or easily fall off.
 - Masks should fit snuggly on the face, with 3 layers of material, and cover the nose, the mouth and below the chin.

Cohorts: To minimize the number of individuals that students and staff interact with, students will be divided into cohorts. Interaction between the different cohorts will not be allowed. Student cohorts are as follows:

- Classroom/Division
 - o Division
 - Preschool (Montessori and Kindergarten)
 - Primary (Grades 1 to 3)
 - Junior (Grades 4 to 6)

To facilitate the allocation of cohorts:

- Washrooms downstairs by the preschool will be allocated to Grades 1 to 6
- Preschool classes have access to washrooms in their classroom.
- The schoolyard will be physically divided by cohort
 - o Recess
 - o Lunch
 - o Before School Programs
 - o After School Programs
- Entry and exit and movement in hallways and stairs will be allocated to maximize social distancing and to minimize the intersecting of cohorts.

Classrooms: Students will remain in their workspace for most of their classes, and not move to other workplaces except for programs such as Physical Education

- All students will be assigned a desk/chair, at a socially appropriate distance from each other.
 - Students cannot change seating arrangements unless it is approved and facilitated by the teacher.
 - o At no time should personal supplies be shared with other students.
 - o Teachers will provide students with detailed protocols for their classrooms.
 - o Where possible, classes may be held outside as an alternative.

Laptops and Electronics:

To reduce the transfer of paper from students to teachers and teachers to students:

- Students should never share materials, including electronics and must maintain social distancing when using electronics.
- Students will be permitted to bring electronics for use at lunch recess (12:15 p.m. to 12:55 p.m.) on Friday, or any day designated as an electronic day.
 - o The electronic device is to be used by the owner, social distancing from the other students.
 - o If social distancing is not maintained the student(s) will be required to shut if off and put it away
 - o If there are repeated issues over not maintaining social distancing then the individual will not be allowed to bring their electronic device.

Lunch and Lunch Recess:

- The cafeteria tables and chairs will not be used by any students for eating lunch
- All students will eat lunch in their assigned room in their assigned seats with their camp teacher
- The cafeteria meals will not be available.
 - o Microwaves will not be available for students to heat food. Use a thermos or provide food that will not need to be warmed up.
- Recess times will be in their cohort designated areas outside or inside (inclement weather)
 - o At all times students will need to wear a mask, indoors and outdoors.
- The use of the Creative Playground will be by cohort. Students are required to wear masks when on the creative playground.

Before Camp (7:00 to 8:40 a.m.) and After Camp Programs: (until 6:00 pm)

The After Camp Program will end at 6:00 p.m. Because of social distancing and cohorts, our traditional Before Camp and After Camp Programs will continue to be significantly revamped. Our traditional free play will be restricted within the guidelines of the protocols required for camps.

Parents are strongly encouraged to minimize the amount of time that your child remains in the programs by dropping off students as late as possible and picking them up as early as possible.

- Whenever possible, the Before and After Camp Programs will be held in the front yard in the assigned cohort areas
- When it is not possible to hold the Before and After Camp programs in the front yard:
 - o Before
 - o There will be an indoor area assigned for each cohort while maintaining social distancing and wearing masks.

Pick-up of students at the end of the day: Once again the focus will be on reducing the number of parents entering the building to avoid congestion to maintain social distancing. Accommodations will be made for preschool children due to their ages. Access is limited to one parent or caregiver per family.

- Between 3:40 and 6:00 p.m. Montessori and Kindergarten parents can enter the camp to pick up their children.
 - o Masks must be worn and social distancing maintained at all times.
 - o Limit the time at pickup to facilitate the pace of pickup for other families.
- Between 3:50 and 4:30 p.m., parents of students Grades 1 to 6 cannot enter the camp
- Between 4:30 to 6:00, parents of Grade 1 to 6 students are discouraged from entering the camp.
 - o If a parent of a Grade 1 to Grade 6 student needs to enter, it is permitted but on a "need to basis".

A parent is allowed to enter the camp with a mask between 4:30 and 6:00 to pick up their child.

• If you need to meet your child inside the building to assist them between 4:30 and 6:00 p.m., you can enter the building wearing your mask, use sanitizer when you enter and go to the area that your child is located to pick them up.
